#### **English Proficiency Exemption**

If you have completed at least two years in a secondary school (as recognized by CBU) or have completed at least 30 credit hours (or equivalent) at a post-secondary institution (as recognized by CBU) where English is the primary language of instruction, you are not required to submit a language score. Official documentation such as an official Medium of Instruction (MOI) letter from your previous institution will be required to confirm this period of study was in English.

\*\*Please note: If you meet the English Proficiency Exemption and you submit a language score anyway, your score will be assessed against the minimum score requirements listed above. If you meet the English Proficiency Exemption and have submitted a score that falls below the minimum score requirements above, your application will be deemed inadmissible.

# **Bachelor of Engineering Transfer**

#### **Alberta Requirements**

- 65% Average
- English 30-1
- Math 30-1, Math 30-2 or Math 31 (pre-calc recommended)
- 2 Science 30 or 31 level (chemistry & physics recommended)
- 1 additional 30 or 31 level course

CBU delivers the first two years of the four-year Bachelor of Engineering program, with the final two years delivered at Dalhousie University. Reminder to applicants applying into Engineering in Nova Scotia, CBU does not issue the credential for the program. It is a transfer into Dalhousie's program (the only institution in Nova Scotia currently issuing the final BEng credential).

- The first year of the program is common for all six discipline options. At the end of
  the first year, you must make a decision on a specialty. These include civil,
  environmental, electrical, industrial, mechanical and chemical engineering.
  Application is made at this time to both CBU and Dalhousie for a seat in the
  particular discipline of choice.
- During year two, you will be registered at both CBU and Dalhousie University.
- Years three and four will be completed at Dalhousie University.

Students can also combine a BSc in either chemistry or mathematics with the Engineering Diploma. This program requires a third year of study at CBU to complete the BSc, followed by two years at Dalhousie University to complete the BEng.

## Bachelor of Technology (Nautical Science) at Coast Guard College

Together with the <u>Canadian Coast Guard College</u> (CCGC), the Bachelor of Technology (Nautical Science) is a unique program where students focus on marine safety and environmental protection. From a career in marine engineering, navigation or even as a ship's officer, you will learn watch-keeping, environmental response procedures and search and rescue.

Students gain hands-on experience as they learn to maneuver a variety of vessels in all types of sea and ice conditions. You will become comfortable operating numerous engineering systems aboard a real vessel. Systems include hydraulics, propulsion plant, air conditioning systems and electrical and electronic systems. There are also opportunities for using a state-of-the-art propulsion plant simulator and practical training at the CCG College and at sea.

Please note, students must apply directly through the Canadian Coast Guard College for the Bachelor of Technology (Nautical Science) program, not through CBU. # **Bachelor of Engineering Technology**

The Bachelor of Engineering Technology degree does not lead directly to a Professional Engineering designation, but provides a strong foundation to pursue a career in the engineering field.

## **Bachelor of Science in Nursing**

#### **Alberta Requirements**

- Minimum of 70% in each required course
- English 30-1
- Math 30-1, Math 30-2 or Math 31
- 2 Science 30 or 31 level (biology & chemistry recommended)
- 1 additional 30 or 31 level course
- Completion of CASPer Exam
- We did remove the early admission requirements of applicants having to have higher grades in grade 11. We are just using the regular admission requirements when reviewing their grade 11 marks. This is a big change for the Nursing applicants that they no longer need to have 85% in each individual required course

\*\*We recommend applying for direct-entry from High School before January. The reason for this is to take an earlier Casper test date as we cannot guarantee seat availability in the program in April when the last test is. Weight for application is 40% Casper results and 60% based on their average in the required courses for admission.

Applications will remain incomplete and will indicate "action required" on their CBU Future Student Portal for Nursing until we receive their Casper results. This is a common concern we see, but as long as the applicants have uploaded everything else and have registered for the Casper, we will mark their application complete once Casper test results are available to us. Casper test results are received exactly **2 weeks after the test date**, we do not share results with applicants and they will receive an email with which percentile they scored in, but will not be provided an actual score.

In previous years, admissions has waited until we received all applications and then ranked

them, but this year we working in batches so that letters can go out sooner than later but still keeping with our Academic Calendar requirements that they need the Casper to be completed before an acceptance is issued. We have been sending the student ID's weekly to new applicants as well, but in the meantime they can use the Casper CBU student ID placeholder 1234567 to register.

#### Why study at CBU?

CBU students have access to a wide variety of nursing practice placements (hospitals, community, long-term care) within the Nova Scotia Health Authority as well as private community partners that provide the experiential learning nursing students need to bridge theory to practice.

You also have an opportunity to take part in a two-week International Experience designed to help you learn about health and nursing in another culture and engage in service-learning. Our students have travelled to Quito, Bali, and Argentina. Students have the opportunity to study for a Specialty Nursing Certificate in oncology, acute and critical care, mental health, public health or Indigenous health nursing, along with others. Additionally, qualified students can enhance their research knowledge and skills by completing an advanced major in an area of interest.

## **Bachelor of Health Sciences (Public Health)**

#### **Alberta Requirements**

- 65% Average
- English 30-1
- Math 30-1, Math 30-2 or Math 31
- 2 Science 30 or 31 level (chemistry is required)
- 1 additional 30 or 31 level course

Specifically, the public health program at CBU focuses on environmental health. This segment of public health centres on keeping people healthy in the places they live, work and play. Our program taps into the natural resources of our region, focusing on food safety, water and air quality, communicable disease control, and occupational health and safety. We currently offer three streams of our program.

- Stream One is the <u>four-year option</u> that a student graduating from high school, or someone without post-secondary education, could take.
- Stream Two is an <u>accelerated two year option</u> for students with a previous science degree or a similar degree/diploma.
- Stream Three is <u>an in-career option</u> available only to military workers seeking a degree. These military workers must be certified by the Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors.
