All offers will be made by the end of May 2025. Students have until June 2, 2025, to respond via the OUAC.

• Bachelor of Engineering:

A new major, **Mechatronics, is now available (co-op and regular)*** - Provides students with a strong foundation in the design of computer-controlled electromechanical systems.

- Bachelor of Science: Environmental Geomatics major (previously paused) has been renamed
 to Earth Observation and Geographic Information Science and moved to the Bachelor of
 Science in Environmental Sciences degree program Students will gain expertise in earth
 systems such as freshwater and carbon as well as develop skills in evaluating environmental
 risks and hazards
- Bachelor of Science: Biological and Medical Physics major (co-op and regular) has been reinstated - This major combines the University of Guelph's strengths in physics, biochemistry and molecular biology applied to healthcare and the medical field. This interdisciplinary major will help students understand how physicists contribute to our knowledge of the biological world.
- Bachelor of Science: Plant Science major (co-op and regular) has been reinstated This major allows students to explore the intricacies of plants through the study of their diversity, growth, development, environmental interactions, and various economic uses. Additionally, students will gain knowledge of advances in molecular biology, plant ecology, systematics, physiology, botany, genetics, agriculture, ethnobotany and biotechnology.
