Students in Social Work or Human Justice will have practicum placements pre-built in. There are internships for students in Education, fieldwork placements for students in Kinesiology, and clinical placements for students in Nursing.

Conditional admissions process	3-step process for conditional admission:
	 Apply for admission and pay the \$100 one-time application fee. Submit transcript by March 15 to meet the early application deadline. The admissions team will look at the five classes required by the faculty and program to calculate the admission average (both 20 and 30-level classes are assessed for conditional admission).

	calculated for by our office when students submit an application to the U of R. We have fourteen \$40,000 Chancellor's Award scholarships which are application-required, this focuses on student-leadership and community involvement and requires two reference letters.

NEW INSTITUTION UPDATES/HIGHLIGHTS

Faculty of Arts

- Bachelor of Arts in Journalism, News Media, and Communication
- Bachelor of Indigenous Journalism & Communication Arts

The new Bachelor of Arts in Journalism, News Media, and Communication is a four-year integrated program across all years of a student's degree. This is a direct-entry program.

It includes the study of traditional areas of journalism like broadcasting and print, as well as digital media, new avenues for journalistic output such as podcasting, and a new focus on strategic communications. The redesigned curricula means that the program is up-to-date in terms of the changing landscapes of journalism, digital media and communications practices.

The program builds Indigenous Communication Arts and Public Relations courses into the degree, while offering more choice of electives to encourage students to take related courses in other subject areas.

All of our undergraduate students complete a paid 13-week internship as part of the program.

Bachelor in French as a Second Language

The Bachelor of Arts in French as a Second Language is more than just language acquisition. Our program aims to guide students toward achieving a proficiency level of B2 or C1 on CEFR French tests while cultivating practical language skills for effective communication in various Francophone environments. Through a comprehensive curriculum integrating grammar, writing, and speaking skills, students explore specialised concentrations tailored to their interests and career paths. Through deep exploration, students gain insights into the histories, traditions, and nuances of Francophone communities worldwide.

Faculty of Media, Art, and Performance

• Bachelor of Fine Arts in Creative Technologies

Creative Technologies and Design is for students who have an interest in art, design, technology, culture, and interdisciplinary study. Explore digital culture while working in 3D animation, interactive media and installations, visual communication and graphic design, physical computing, creative computation, virtual and augmented reality, sound art, digital storytelling, computer gaming, and sound technologies.

Creative Technologies and Design degrees can include courses from all programs in the Faculty of Media, Art, and Performance, the Department of Computer Science, and the Faculty of Engineering, with opportunities to draw on courses from the Faculties of Arts, Education, and more.

ENGINEERING & NURSING REQUIREMENTS

The University of Regina calculates the admission average for Alberta high school students using the higher of the high school reported final grade or the provincial reported final grade. The student must receive credit for the course.

Engineering

Direct entry with a minimum admission average of 70%.

The following five courses are required to calculate the overall final admission average:

- ELA 30-1 (The equivalent grade 12-level French language arts subject may also be used)
- Math 30-1 or Math 31 (Math 31 recommended)
- Chemistry 30
- Physics 30
- One 30-level math or science course Applicants will be admitted as an Engineering

Enginerring Qualifying students - if they are missing one subject that is used for Final Admission, but still have an admission average of 70% on the remaining four courses.

Nursing

Nursing is a competitive, direct-entry program that is offered in association with Saskatchewan Polytechnic.

A minimum of 70% in each of the following courses is required:

- ELA 30-1
- Math 30-1 or Math 30-2 or Math 31
- Chemistry 30 Biology 30

- One 30-level math, science, language, or social science course

The 2023 admission average cut-off for high school students is 77.4%.
