IB credit information	Diploma or Certificate students may request to be evaluated for advanced credit for completed Higher level courses with a minimum final score of 5. At the discretion of the Faculty, advanced credit of up to 18 units may be granted for completed Higher Level courses with a minimum final score of 5.
AP credit information	Applicants who have completed AP courses will be considered for admission to a Level I program. Applicants who have completed A.P. exams through the College Board in acceptable courses and achieve a minimum grade of 4 will be considered for up to 18 units of advanced credit. For all students who have completed the full AP courses and the examinations through the College Board, an official copy of the final <i>Advanced Placement</i> <i>Examination Results Report</i> from the College Board is required as part of the evaluation process.
Policy on repeated courses	For students who repeat two or less courses, or a single course two or less, the highest mark is used to calculate an admission average. Students repeating more than two courses, or an individual course more than two times, may be asked to provide a letter explaining their circumstances. Application fee	OUAC application allows three (3) applications for \$156. You can apply to three programs at McMaster. You may also pay a fee per additional application. Please see the OUAC site for more details.
Timing of offers/grades used	Offers are made on a rolling basis and will continue to be sent out into May. A minimum of three Grade 12 courses, with interim or final grades, and registration in any remaining required courses must be provided for an assessment to be made.
Deferral policy	 McMaster will normally only grant deferrals on offers of admission when there are special extenuating circumstances. Each case is evaluated on its own merit. A request for deferral (to the subsequent Fall term) will be considered under the following circumstances: the student has accepted their undergraduate offer of admission to the university; and all conditions outlined in the Offer of Admission letter have been met; and the student is not intending to return to secondary school or attend another post-secondary institution during the deferral period.

Required Courses:

Completion of High School Diploma plus five academic courses numbered 30 or 31 including:

- 1. English (English Language Arts 30-1)
- 2. Calculus (Math 31 or AP Calculus)
- 3. Chemistry (Chemistry 30)
- 4. Physics (Physics 30)

The blended mark for ELA 30-1 is used for admission Please submit first semester grades and a list of all courses for the entire year no later than February 15th.

Application Deadline: January 15, 2025

Supplementary Application Deadline: January 30, 2025 at noon EST **Supporting Documentation Deadline**: Document deadline is April 1, 2025 for supporting documentation, including English proficiency test (if applicable). Submit new grades, as soon as they are available, to your applicant portal.

Admission Decision Timing:

OUAC 'B' applicants will hear back normally between four or five weeks after all supporting/required documentation noted on McMaster's Applicant Portal is marked as "Completed."

Co-op/Internship: Students can opt into the co-op stream at any point before their final year.

Nursing:

Anticipated Admission Range: Min. 85%. The weighting for final decision is based on 80% grades and 20% CASPer score.

Required Courses:

Completion of High School Diploma plus five courses numbered 30 or 31 including:

- 1. English (English Language Arts 30-1)
- 2. One of Calculus (Math 31 or AP Calculus) or Pre-Calculus Math (Math 30-1)
- 3. Biology (Biology 30)
- 4. Chemistry (Chemistry 30)

The blended mark for ELA 30-1 is used for admission Please submit first semester grades and a list of all courses for the entire year no later than February 15th.

Application Deadline: January 15, 2025

Supplementary Application Deadline: You must complete CASPer on one of the dates listed on the CASPer website.
